

# Mid Wales win Welsh title

THE Mid Wales Ladies' golf team has been crowned as the 2011 GUW County Champions, after they beat Monmouthshire in the prestigious Welsh final at Aberdovey.

In a high-quality final, despite dreadful weather conditions, they beat their rivals by seven and a half to one and a half, having played foursomes in the morning and won all the afternoon singles matches.

The Mid Wales team had reached the county finals for the first time this year, by winning the North Wales division, for Caernarfonshire and Anglesey, Denbighshire and Flintshire, and Mid Wales.

Opponents Monmouthshire were winners of the South Wales division, representing Carmarthenshire and Pembrokeshire, Glamorganshire, and Monmouthshire.

Winning the Welsh title at Aberdovey Golf Club was a fitting tribute to the late Pat Morgan, who helped set up the Mid Wales County Golf Association over 30 years ago, and whose dream it was for the team to progress into the county final.

The triumphant Mid Wales team was made up of Sally Wilkinson (Aberdovey), Sara Rees Evans (Penrhos/Aberdovey), vice captain Sherrie Edwards (Builth Wells), captain Sharon Roberts (Cradoc), Judith Davies (Cradoc), Gill Evans (Cradoc), and Julie McAloon (Aberdovey).

At Machynlleth, the Mid Wales county girls' team ended the season on a high, with a victory in a triangular counties match, held against Denbighshire and Flintshire, and Caernarfon and Anglesey.

Representing Mid Wales were members from Aberystwyth, Borth and Ynyslas, Machynlleth, Llanidloes and Welshpool.

The final scores on the day were Mid Wales, in first place with 122 points, Denbighshire and Flintshire, in second place with 115 points, and Caernarfon and Anglesey, in third position, with 99 points.
